

# Lights Out, Texas! DFW Building Challenge

Fall 2025

Join Reunion Tower and other DFW leaders to dim the lights for migrating birds.

We're calling on public buildings and commercial properties in North Texas to step up and join the Lights Out, Texas! DFW Building Challenge this fall.

## Why This Matters

Texas sits in the Central Flyway, where billions of birds migrate each spring and fall. Bright city lights disorient them at night, pulling them into cities and could lead to deadly glass strikes. Up to one billion birds die in the U.S. each year from window collisions. By reducing non-essential lighting, we can save birds, cut energy costs, and protect our night skies.

## Eligible Participants

Cities, counties, government buildings, schools and universities and commercial properties in the North Texas region.

## The Challenge

Participants pledge to:

- Reduce 75% of non-essential lighting during peak migration (11 p.m.–6 a.m.), including turning off or dimming decorative and façade lighting.
- Share the Lights Out message with employees, tenants, and networks.

## **Key Migration Periods**

Select the level of your participation

- Migration Guardian Full 8-week commitment (Sept. 5 Oct. 29)
  - Protects the full spectrum of migrants, from early species like
    Hummingbirds, Orioles, and Buntings to later migrants.
- Wildlife Steward Minimum 4-week commitment during DFW peak migration (Sept. 24 – Oct. 29)
  - Covers the regional core peak migration, when large numbers of Warblers,
    Thrushes, and Sparrows are moving through.
- Keen Observer Less than 4 weeks during migration
  - Ideal for buildings eager to stay informed and explore future participation opportunities.
